









This house will need natural gas so the family can keep warm during cold Alaska winter! Can you help Natural Gas Gus find his way through the pipeline to the house?

When you unplug something, pull from the plug, not the cord.

- When you are plugging in something, make sure the plug fits easily into the wall socket.
- Don't climb trees or fly kites, balloons, or other toys near power lines.

If you see a power line on the ground outside, tell an adult. Stay far away from the power line and anything that is around it.

Make sure to turn the oven off when it is not being used.

Keep electric objects away from the sink and bath. Find an adult if an electric object falls into water, and don't reach into the water.

Natural gas has a rotten egg smell added to it. Tell a grown-up if you smell something like this, it may be a natural gas leak.





Only fill up the tub halfway when you are taking a bath, or take a short five-minute shower.




Turn off the water while brushing your teeth
