If a community is on the list but currently has local dial-up or broadband service, the community is not eligible under this program.
3. No Local Dial-Up (NDLU). Access to the Internet is not toll free.
4. 700 Access service is an offering where community residents access the Internet through a 700 number. Residents pay a monthly fee and 10 cents a minute charge.
