


# Relay Traffic

- Alaska has seen increases in traffic or less than the nationwide averages due to outreach




# CapTel Traffic

- Alaska has shown growth in this product due to the Outreach performed.





# IP CapTel Traffic




- The IP CapTel minutes are paid for by the FCC that benefit Alaska residents that the State of Alaska does not have to pay for through the TRS State Contract.





AK RELAY - ATLA

#### Successes:

October was a busy month with several conventions and events. We successfully provided outreach to close to 5000 people on our trips, attendance at 6 conferences or events, and through our mailer. We visited 4 communities, but reached many more as dozens were represented at some of the events in Anchorage. Outreach this month included contact with more than \$2 different entities including Audiologists, Tribal and Native organizations, community-based service providers, telephone companies and more.

In early October, we partnered with the University of Alaska Disability Support Services Team and other disability support service providers to people within the Anchorage area to provide a Disability Awareness Event. We gathered in the Student Union where many students congregate in between classes. We were excited for an opportunity to share about Relay services to both teachers and students.

In Mid-October, we were an exhibitor at the Alaska Federation of Natives (AFN) Convertion. The AFN convention is the largest representative annual gathering in the United States of any Native peoples. Delegates are elected on a population formula of one representative per twenty-five Native residents in the area and delegate participation rates at the annual convention bylocally exceed 95 percent. In our booth, we provided an information table with brochures and handouts. We demonstrated equipment and processed applications for the Equipment Distribution Program. It was estimated that about 4000 people were in attendance at this convention.

We were also an exhibitor at the Alaska Speech, Language, and Hearing Association (AKSHA) Conference. They provide a yearly convertion for ongoing education for professionals in these fields. We hosted a table where we provided information about Relay services and demonstrated equipment. We explained the process of the Speech-Eospeech service and how the Capf eliphones work. Many Speech Language Therapists were excited to learn about the Speech-to-Speech service. Also, we met a travelling audiclogist named Dr. Susan Burling. She was excited to discuss the possibility of partnering together when travelling to various areas of the state. She will

have a table at the Homer Health Fair in November and invited us to set-up at her table. We are excited about this opportunity because she would be willing to sign certification forms in the EDP applications for people who qualify for the service.

Toward the end of October, we were one of the exhibitors at the Alaska Telephone Association (ATA) showcase. This provided a great opportunity to meet with ATA's member companies to talk about the equipment and services we provide. We explained how Alaska Relay is vital for people with hearing or speech difficulties to access telecom service in Alaska. Over 60 companies and agencies from the telecom industry were proposed at the showcase.

Not including the AKSHA conference, we were also able to provide outreach to audiologists in Wasilla and Dillingham. In October, we also sent out a flyer explaining

Relay services and the CapTel phone 250 people. We identified participants of another one of our programs who could possibly benefit from Alaska Relay services:

#### Challenaes:

We were able to start 13 applications for the equipment distribution program. However, of those 13 individuals, only 7 of them had landline phone service. 6 of them stated that

 As more relay users are going mobile, we will need to make the Alaska Relay website easier to view using wireless devices or tablets as well make it accessible for low vision users.


